



## Box Hockey Risk Management Plan

HAZARDS	RISK ASSESSMENT	RISK CONTROLS
1. Site location delivery	Pedestrian traffic	Park truck outside of venue. Inspect access and observe pedestrian traffic
2. Site location area	Level of site/suitability to walk around hockey course. Check for holes which may cause tripping.	Walk perimeter and internal space to enable safe playing area. Inspect playing surface. Fill any potholes and expose any hazards.
3. Erection and layout of hockey course	Public walking through set up areas. Tripping over golf equipment.	Establish safe perimeters, keeping clear all pathways or exits.
4. Site location playing area	Location of playing hockey boxes. Space between boxes to walk.	Position boxes to avoid pucks being hit towards fence and public spectators. Check space in walkways
5. Players of box hockey	Not hitting puck correctly.	Instructions to be given by signs and verbally to any staff and players
6. Players of box hockey	Correct sticks and pucks for junior players	Observe height and age of players and give suitable sticks and pucks to use
7. Stray pucks out of playing area	Tripping by pedestrians and dangerous bouncing pucks.	Observe players. Speak to players about playing. Retrieve all pucks that go out of the area.
